



St. Juliana — A Saint for Our Times

The glory of the Roman Empire eventually degenerated into decline and corruption. St. Paul in his letter to the Romans (I:18-32) describes the depravity that had developed by the middle of the first century. It was to such a culture that the Apostles preached the teachings of Jesus Christ crucified. Rome and the empire officially rejected them, but this new Faith in Jesus spread rapidly among the people, young and old alike.

Saints Peter and Paul were among the first to shed their blood for Christ in the persecutions which extended in a series from the Emperor Nero (64 A.D.) through the reign of the Emperor Diocletian (305 A.D.). Freedom came for Christians with the reign of the Emperor Constantine (324 A.D.), whose conversion was no doubt influenced by the millions of Christian martyrs. Their life and faith in Jesus was so strong that embracing the evangelical counsels (Matt. 19:12, Mark 12:25, Luke 20, 34, St. Paul I Cor. 7:8-35) was common even among the youth. Torture and death could not dissuade them.

Among the great number of youths who gave their lives rather than abandon their faith in Jesus Christ was St. Juliana. The Roman martyrology, under the date of February 16th at Cumae in Campania, Italy commemorates St. Juliana - Virgin and Martyr. Her father, the pagan Africanus, refused to accept the fact of his daughter's Christianity. Against her will, he betrothed her to the prefect Evilasius, who had nothing but contempt for faith and chastity. For her refusal to marry Evalasius and worship with the Pagans she was thrown into prison where she was severely tempted by Satan to compromise her faith.

She triumphed in this "wrestling" with Satan, as she described it, and consequently is usually depicted by artists as subduing him. After various tortures she was finally beheaded in the year 305 A.D.

Her uncompromising fidelity to her faith and virtue makes her a fitting model for todays youth, who are likewise confronted and tempted by the standards and allurements of modern pagan society.





On Sunday afternoon, April 22, 1951, the faithful of St. Juliana parish joyfully gathered on the 12+ acre tract of property, which Archbishop Joseph P. Hurley had acquired and designated as the site for their new school, church, convent and eventually a rectory. Archbishop Hurley was bishop of the Diocese of St. Augustine, which at that time included West Palm Beach. With a sense of gratitude they asked God's blessing as Father John Francis McKcown, pastor, turned the first shovel of dirt to break ground. Their dreamed-of parish buildings would soon be a welcome reality.

Since the founding of the parish they had offered their Sunday Masses in the Carefree Theatre on the corner of Dixie Highway and Flamingo Drive. Father Patrick D. O'Brien, the founding pastor, would jokingly refer to these temporary quarters as St. Carefree Church. There were, of course, the usual inconveniences — kneeling sideways on the hard floor between theatre seats at the Consecration of the Mass and the little children asking why they cannot have pop-corn. These were accepted in good spirits as part of the sacrifice needed to get the new parish under way.

Previous to the founding the new parish of St. Juliana, the Catholic people of the south and west areas of the city had to travel to St. Ann's Church and school. This became increasingly difficult during World War II and the years that followed. This period was one of intense growth for the Church in South Florida. Several new parishes were opened each year in the diocese so that adequate facilities for the spiritual welfare of the people would be located as convenient as possible to their homes. The first buildings constructed in these new parishes were a school and a modest hall where people could gather for Mass and other reunions.

This was also the plan for St. Juliana parish. Father McKeown, however, with fore-sight and wisdom pushed a bit harder to have the buildings designed in Romanesque style. Consequently, they have been the pride of St. Juliana parishioners during these twenty-five years. The Church, school and convent were completed in eight months and were dedicated by Archbishop Hurley on December 8, 1951.

The ceremony will be brief and conducted in an orderly manner. Please do not park your cars on Pine Terrace.

We thank all for the great help they have given during the long preparations for building this new parish. Many have worked to the point of fatigue and many also have contributed to the building fund to the point of great sacrifice. Those few who have not completed their pledges please arrange to do so now. Naturally we now need a great deal of money to complete the building plans.

BAPTISMS: Every Sunday at 3:15 in St. Ann's Church. Arrangements must be made during the week.

St. Juliana Church and school have been a well-spring of holiness and learning for the Catholic Community of the area. The Church Baptistry has seen 2,980 reborn to supernatural life as children of God. The sanctuary of the church has been the scene of 888 couples being united in the Sacrament of Matrimony. Countless thousands have been relieved of the burden of sin through the Sacrament of Penance in the confessionals. All have been strengthened and nourished by Jesus Himself in Mass and Holy Communion. From the Sanctuary the parish priests have regularly brought the Blessed Sacrament and consecrated oil to the sick of the parish. The church has also been the source of many graces and favors through the missions and novenas conducted regularly over the years.

St. Juliana School opened its doors for class on Jan. 8, 1952 with 102 children in four grades and Kindergarten. Four Sisters of St. Joseph arrived to conduct the new school. Each year the school increased in enrollment and by 1959 it became necessary to expand the school to meet the increased enrollment.

Father George Bucko organized the fund-raising drive and supervised the planning and building of the new two story wing on the northeast corner of the property. The new school structure was blessed by Monsignor Jeremiah P. O'Mahoney, then pastor of St. Edward's parish, Palm Beach on March 29, 1960.

The school has provided sound intellectual and moral training for 2,610 youths who attended St. Juliana's for all or part of their elementary education. The school has also provided religious instruction and training for the children attending public school. The cafeteria and classrooms have proved an invaluable asset for the adult education programs and courses. They have likewise been the center for the various parish youth programs such as the Catholic Youth Organization and a complete program of scouting.







